Head Lice

We still have some cases of head lice. Please check, and treat if necessary. Your chemist or GP can give you information about the latest treatments. Please also ensure long hair is tied back to prevent the lice from walking from one head to another! A local Chemist suggests the current treatment to use is 'Hedrin'. There is also a very good comb called a 'Nitty Gritty', it can help eradicate Head Lice if used regularly.
