
SMSC at Frittenden CEP A glimpse of some of the things we do.



- Promoting, demonstrating and using our Christian Values: Compassion, Love, Trust,
 Wisdom, Respect and Thankfulness as a basis for our rules and conduct
- Collective worship- led by staff and children. Clothes linked to church seasons, liturgy, prayer, reflection and lighting the candle. Music and singing
 - Thinking time. Children tell us they value this
 - Open the Book church led every Thursday. Children join in eagerly
- Strong connections with Church through the governing body and Open the Book and the community
 - Annual leavers services, Christmas, Easter, Harvest and other significant occasions are celebrated in the church
 - Weekly celebration service held in school with parents in attendance
 - RE teaching is good and children echo this
 - Enquiry approach to R.E: Understanding Christianity
 - Children ask Big Questions!
 - Our school ethos is tangible and commented on by visitors
- Mindfulness and meditation are used by teachers to promote spirituality and wellbeing
 - Pupils use reflection areas in classrooms and RE working walls
- Worry monsters are available in classes and through a trust culture children feel able to discuss their issues
 - CW board and prayer tree in the hall are used
 - Prayers are said at lunch time and the end of the day as well as in CW
 - Promotion of and an understanding of the Fruit of The Spirit
 - PSHE delivery
 - Creative curriculum links to all areas
 - Forest School delivery inspires awe and wonder throughout the seasons
 - Residential trips (Carroty Wood Christian run)
- Visits to place of worship including synagogues, mosques, Anglican, Baptist, Methodist and Roman Catholic Churches
 - Museum/gallery visits
 - Self-assessment/peer assessment
 - Questioning and participation when learning active engagement



- Christian Values linked to the teachings of Jesus, classes linked to parables
- Collective worship focus upon values. Use of Fruit of the Spirit as a weekly focus over a term
 - Kindness week
 - School council
 - Understanding of democracy visits to the Palace of Westminster
 - Helen Grant (MP) visited during Parliament Week
 - Visit by a local Magistrate who works exclusively in child court
 - Consistent use of school behaviour policy values underpinning behaviour
 - Charity giving: support in the local area, nationally and globally
 - Behaviour on trips is regularly positively acknowledged
 - Governors reports
 - Good relationships between all members of the school community
 - Literacy genres enabling discussion of moral dilemmas via persuasion, debate etc.,
- Text selection such as: Rabbit Proof Fence, Journey to Jo'burg, flotsam, Private Peaceful,
 Friend or Foe.
 - Rewards/ Sanctions/ consequences for actions are known
 - Class/school council elections
 - Smart Days, debates such as 'Who is the Greatest Briton?' Emmeline Pankhurst....
 - Environment topics including local and conservation in the wider world
 - Forest School looking after the environment flora and fauna
 - Online safety Ambassadors (Year 5/6) / Internet safety talks by PCSO
 - Safety in action visits
 - Fire safety talks delivered across the school
 - NSPCC visits share aware
 - Creation of Class rules
 - Pupils know right from wrong
 - Drama scenarios based on PSHE/ English / History



- Taking part in Journeys Church event
- Harvest festival. Collection of and delivery of food to village members
 - Christmas: parties, talent shows, visits, at Senior Citizens residence
 - Easter
 - Open the Book Services
- Performances such as leavers production, Potter Class Christmas production and Wells
 Class re-enacting the Easter Story
 - Talent Shows.
 - Children lead collective worship on a Wednesday and Friday
 - Collective worship gang are involved daily in worship
 - Larchmere visits to read and engage with residence
 - Choir Harvest lunch, o2, Church Services
 - Wells Class singing at community events with Mrs Olney
 - Smart Days in mixed ages
 - Seating in the lunch hall/during CW can be friends / houses / family / buddy
 - Parental events
 - Langar event Year 3 / 4 parents invited in for food which had been prepared by children
 - Deliverance of CW in groups selected by children. Children plan and deliver.
- Sports Day and Leavers Services Parents stay for lunch with their children (picnic in the Paddock)
 - School council events such as fayres, cake sales and arranging charity focused events.
 - Trips: including residential
 - Play leaders / online safety ambassadors
 - Buddy system
 - Sport teams/competitions via WOKSSA and Inspire to Compete
 - Visitors to school
 - After school clubs including outside providers

- Chinese New Year- whole school celebration and activities led by Graham Nunn and Nancy
 - R.E. coverage encompassing other religions
 - Smart Days linked to Great Britons, The Fire of London and Diwali
 - Singing Religious and non-religious trips
 - Christmas performances
 - Visitors to school (parent Hajj. German/ Italian tradition)
- Learning about other children's religions, i.e. Islam and Jehovah Witness children in the school community
 - Trips to museums and galleries to find out cultures and heritage. Elgin's marbles / Rosetta Stone / Roman influences.
 - Charity focus causes identified by school council
- Collective worship significant dates and festivals (including those of other religions)
